Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

## Security at shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

## Your Judge is Mrs Christina Wright (Kamroyal)



My love affair with Dobes began in 1976 when Lisa (Veronique from Achenburg) joined the family. She was great with my three children all under five at the time, but was excellent at finding every hole in the fence to escape. Fortunately we were living in a small Hamlet near Newark at the time so traffic wasn't a problem – catching her sometimes was especially hard if the local butcher was having a BBQ in his garden. She was our introduction to the Show ring, with some success but even more importantly many new friends.

Over the next forty years our family always included at least one Dobe and usually several. Once a member of the family they stayed whether successful in the show ring or not. When breeding, temperament was very important and several of my pups lived with severely handicapped people and enhanced their lives.

I am proud to have bred and successfully handled Sophie (Ch. Kamroyal Krystal). Several others won CC's and RCC's.

I served on the Dobermann Club as both Secretary and Membership Secretary until moving to the North of England.

Looking through my records it was interesting that my application to the Kennel Club in 1990 to be passed to award Challenge Certificates included 414 dogs judged at fourteen Open Shows. How entries have declined!

I have been fortunate to judge several Breed Club Shows over the years, but it is especially significant to judge this Show as I am very proud to be President.

To the Officers and Committee many thanks for inviting me to judge and to Exhibitors I hope you enjoy the Show.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.30am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence **after completion of the Judging of the Open Show and Not Before 11.30 am.**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees. £20.00 for the first entry with each dog, all subsequent entries £5.00. Fourth dog same owner FREE (Excludes partnerships unless all 4 dogs owned by same party). Veteran £5.00. Not for Competition (4-6 months) £2.00. Catalogues £3.50 prepaid with entries (no catalogues will be available on the day). Membership of the NECDS is FREE with your entry. Full Page advert Text only £10 with a photo £15.
6. No Prize money is to be offered at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex **but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a** Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, **the eligible dogs are those declared** Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Best Veteran in Show will be called from Best Veteran Dog and Best Veteran Bitch from Classes 1 and 11.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the **Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.** These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11. 2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition. 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board. (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed. (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive. 4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis. 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf. 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations



must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office 43 F(B) before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint

16. All dog's resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority of Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS – Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
  - Keep your dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for long extended lengths of time.

Remember if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

18. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by an action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
20. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the setup period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
21. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees
22. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number
23. Should any judge be unable to fulfil their engagement the Committee reserve the right to appoint others in their place. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
24. The Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to a dog or dogs, or any property whether arising from accident or any cause whatsoever, not for any act or omission of themselves their officer's servants or others and it is on this understanding that entries are received.
25. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
26. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
27. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
28. Privacy Statement Your data will be stored in accordance with the Kennel Club and Data Protection Act Requirements.

**DOG FOULING AND GROOMING WASTE**

Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club licenced show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal for such fouling will be provided.

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES

(The word DOG includes both sexes)

In the following definition a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificate are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 26th October 2019. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options: -

1. Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

2. Transfer

- a. If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class Minor Puppy and Puppy accepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b. For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class which is over age but under twelve calendar months or age, eighteen calendar months or age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c. For any reason other than the above the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**YEARLING** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**BEGINNERS** For Owner, handler or exhibit not having won a first prize at a Championship or Open Show.

**MAIDEN** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

**NOVICE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or Three or more First Prizes at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

**TYRO** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

**DEBUTANT** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at a Championship Show where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

**UNDER GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

- GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or Four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or Five or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- MINOR LIMIT** For dogs which have not won two Challenge Certificates or three or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- MID LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, **or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars** or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, **or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars** or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- OPEN** For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show
- VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show
- FIELD TRIAL** For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations
- WORKING TRIAL** For dogs which have won prizes in competition at a Bloodhound Working Trial and Kennel Club licensed Working Trials, held under Kennel Club Regulations
- STUD DOG** For stud dogs and at least two progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the Show
- BROOD BITCH** For Brood Bitches and at least two progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the Show
- NOT FOR COMPETITION** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
